INTERNATIONAL

1) Mitsubishi F-X fighter jet

- Japan has announced that it will jointly develop its next-generation fighter jet with the United Kingdom and Italy as it looks to expand defense cooperation beyond its traditional ally, the United States.
- The Mitsubishi F-X fighter jet will replace the aging fleet of F-2s that Japan previously developed with the United States.

2) Currency Swap Agreement with the Maldives Monetary Authority

- The Reserve Bank of India has signed a Currency Swap Agreement with the Maldives Monetary Authority to enable MMA to make drawals in multiple tranches up to a maximum of \$200 million from the RBI.
- This agreement has been signed under the SAARC Currency Swap Framework.



NATIONAL

1) 'Miracles of Face Yoga'

- The Founder of Manasvani, Mansi Gulati has released her book 'Miracles of Face Yoga', which has been appreciated by the President of India Droupadi Murmu.
- Mansi Gulati, an international Yogi, celebrated author, and thought leader, devoted her efforts to learning everything possible about yoga practices and philosophy.

2) Rooftop Solar Programme

- Central Government announced that it has extended the Rooftop Solar Programme till 31 March, 2026. The subsidy under the programme will be available until the target under the Programme is achieved now.

- The government has advised all residential consumers to not pay any additional charges to any vendor on account of fee for application on the National Portal or any additional charges for net-metering/testing which are not prescribed by the respective distribution company.

3) "The World's 100 Most Powerful Women"

- Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, Biocon Executive Chairperson Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw and Nykaa founder Falguni Nayar are among six Indians who have made it to the Forbes' annual list of "The World's 100 Most Powerful Women".
- Ranked at number 36, Nirmala Sitharaman has made it to the list for the fourth time in a row. In 2021, the 63-year-old minister was ranked at number 37 in the list, while she was in the 41st spot in 2020 and 34th in 2019.



4) SWAMIH Invest Fund-I

- The government has put in an additional Rs 5,000 crore into the SWAMIH Invest Fund-I to help the stressed realty investment platform achieve its final close at Rs 15,530 crore.
- The fund set up under the Special Window for Affordable and Mid-Income Housing is India's largest social impact fund, which said the government recently infused Rs 5,000 crore.

5) Collegium System of Supreme Court

- The Collegium System of Supreme Court is one of the very important topics in understanding the appointment of the Supreme Court judges and the judicial system.
- It is the system of appointment and transfer of judges that has evolved through judgments of the SC, and not by an Act of Parliament or by a provision of the Constitution.

- In a letter to TRS, the EC cited a letter that the party sent to the poll body on October 5 requesting its name changes.

APPOINTMENTS AND RESGINATIONS

1) Shenu Agarwal

- Leading truck and bus maker Ashok Leyland has announced the appointment of Shenu Agarwal as its MD & CEO with immediate effect.
- Agarwal will drive the technology development, growth, and future strategy for Ashok Leyand toward achieving its vision to be among the top 10 Commercial Vehicle players globally.



2) Sushmita Shukla

- The Federal Reserve Bank of New York has appointed Indian-origin Sushmita Shukla as its First Vice President, and Chief Operating Officer, making the insurance industry veteran its highest-ranked official after President and CEO, John C Williams.
- The appointment was approved by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System.

3) Meenesh C Shah

- National Dairy Development Board has appointed Meenesh C Shah as its Managing Director with effect from November 15.
- Union Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Minister Parshottam Rupala informed that the Gujaratbased NDDB does not have regular chairman since December 2020.

SPORTS

1) Eden Hazard

- Belgium captain Eden Hazard has announced his retirement from international football after Belgium's early exit from the FIFA World Cup 2022.
- He was the captain of Belgium in the 2022 FIFA World Cup. Hazard made his international debut in 2008 and scored 33 times in 126 appearances.
- He helped Belgium reach the 2018 World Cup semi-finals, where they lost to eventual champions France, and beat England in the third-placed playoff.

2) Ishan Kishan

- India batter Ishan Kishan has smashed the fastest ODI double century in 126 balls against Bangladesh at the Zahur Ahmed Chowdhury Stadium in Chattogram.
- The wicketkeeper-batsman scored a 150 off boundaries alone, with 24 fours and 10 sixes all around the Zahur Ahmed Chowdhury Stadium. It took an excellent running catch to dislodge Kishan on 210 off 131.

AWARDS AND RECOGNITIONS

1) World Athlete of the year awards

- World champion American hurdler Sydney McLaughlin-Levrone and Swedish pole vaulter Mondo Duplantis won the World Athlete of the year awards.
- McLaughlin-Levrone broke the world women's 400m hurdles record twice while Duplantis set three new world highs this year.
- US-born Swede Duplantis claimed the award for the second time in three years with three world records in 2022 plus the men's world indoor title in March and the world outdoor gold in July.

- Human Rights Day is celebrated across the world on December 10 every year. It marks the day that the United Nations General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in 1948.
