INTERNATIONAL

1) Chris Hipkins will replace Jacinda Ardern as prime minister

- New Zealand's former COVID-19 response minister, Chris Hipkins will replace Jacinda Ardern as prime minister.
- The 44-year-old senior politician must be formally backed by Labour members of parliament to take over as the country's 41st prime minister, following Ardern's shock resignation.
- As leader of the governing party, Hipkins will also become prime minister when Ardern steps down.

2) 'Exercise Cyclone - I'

- The first joint exercise between the special forces of the Indian and the Egyptian Army, 'Exercise Cyclone
- I' started on 14 January at Jaisalmer, Rajasthan, said the Ministry of Defence.
- The exercise aims to bolster defence co-operation between the two countries and focus on sharing professional skills and interoperability of special forces in desert terrain while undertaking counter terrorism, reconnaissance, raids and other special operations.



3) International Day of Education, on 24 January

- Director-General of UNESCO, Audrey Azoulay has decided to dedicate the 2023 International Day of Education (January 24) to Afghan girls and women.
- On the occasion of an event organized at the UN headquarters, UNESCO will renew its call to immediately restore their fundamental right to education.

NATIONAL

1) Indian Olympic Association

- The Indian Olympic Association formed a seven-member committee, including M C Mary Kom and Yogeshwar Dutt, to probe the allegations of sexual harassment against Wrestling Federation of India president Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh by top grapplers.
- This comes after the agitating wrestlers had earlier in the day reached out to the IOA, demanding formation of an enquiry committee to probe the allegations against Singh, a day after threatening to lodge multiple FIRs against the WFI chief.



2) "Nari Shakti"

- "Nari Shakti" (women power) will be driving the theme of this year's Republic Day tableau of Navy.
- Not just the front of the tableau will feature a woman aircrew of a Dornier aircraft flying overhead, but Lt. Commander Disha Amrith has been tasked with commanding its parade contingent.

3) Developmental projects related to irrigation, drinking water, and a National Highway

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated several development programs in Karnataka and Maharashtra ahead of the elections.
- PM Modi visited the Yadgiri and Kalaburagi districts of Karnataka and laid the foundation stone and inaugurated various developmental projects related to irrigation, drinking water, and a National Highway development project at Kodeka in the Yadgir district.

- The Reserve Bank of India has proposed a new set of rules governing loan loss provisioning by banks as it looks to enhance the resilience of the banking system.
- The central bank proposes to amend the regulations governing loan loss provisioning to incorporate a more forward looking "expected credit losses approach" as against the current "incurred loss" approach, the RBI says in a discussion paper.

1) International Cricket Council

- The global governing body of cricket, the International Cricket Council, reportedly lost nearly \$2.5 million in online scam last year.

2) Laxman Rawat of PSPB

- Laxman Rawat of PSPB overcame fellow PSPB challenger Aditya Mehta 9-6 in a best-of-17-frame final. Laxman Rawat of PSPB emerged victorious in the 'Baulkline' NSCI All India Snooker Open.
- Previously, Laxman Rawat won the runner-up in the last edition of the All India Snooker Open losing to Sourav Kothari in the finals. This win marks Laxman Rawat's first major title after 2 to 3 years.

3) Women's U19 T20 World Cup 2023

- The first edition of Women's U19 T20 World Cup 2023 has been launched by International Cricket Council and it is scheduled from 14th January to 29th January 2023. The first match of the Women's U19 T20 World Cup 2023 was played between Australia Women U19 and Bangladesh Women U19 at Willowmoore Park, Benoni.
- A total of 16 teams are participating in the Women's U19 T20 World Cup 2023. The warm-up matches have been played between the 9th to 11th of January 2023 in Johannesburg and Tshwane. The Women's U19 T20 World Cup 2023 will take place in South Africa. There will be 41 matches between 16 teams.
