NATIONAL AFFAIRS

400th Prakash Purab of Guru Tegh Bahadur

- India is celebrating 400th Prakash Purab of Guru Tegh Bahadur. He was the ninth Sikh Guru.
- He was the youngest son of Guru Hargobind Sahib. He wrote 115 hymns that were included in Guru Granth Sahib.

STATE AFFAIRS

Ashirwad Scheme

The cabinet of Punjab approved the hike in Ashirwad Scheme from Rs 21000 to Rs 51000 per beneficiary for the marriage of women of low-income families. The cabinet has also directed to clear all the pending dues.

INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

Carnivac-Cov

- Russia produced the first batch of COVID-19 vaccines **for animals**. The name of the vaccine is **Carnivac-Cov**.
- The World Health Organisation recently confirmed the possibility for transmission of virus between humans and virus. It was produced Rosselkhoznadzor.

"Benin Bronzes"

- The Government of Germany announced that it is to return the artefacts called the "Benin Bronzes" to Nigeria. The "Benin Bronzes" are currently held in the museum of Germany.
- They are a **group of thousand metal sculptures**. These sculptures once decorated the royal palace of Kingdom of Benin, the current Nigeria.

Stratolaunch

- The World largest airplane built by Stratolaunch completed its second test flight from Mojave Air and Space Port in California.
- It reached a top speed of 320 kilometre per hour. The wingspan of the aircraft is 117 metres. This is greater than an American football field.

UK Became the First Country to Adopt Self-Driving Cars on **Motorways**

• The United Kingdom government became the first country in the globe to permit self-driving cars on motorways after the announcement of its plan to regulate the use of self-driving vehicles at slow speeds on motorways.

State Disaster Relief Fund

- The Ministry of Finance released the first instalment of State Disaster Relief Fund. The ministry released 50% of the amount, which is **Rs 4,436.8 crores**.
- The total amount of **SDRF** to be released for 2021-22 is Rs 8,873 crores.

"Scheme of Financial Assistance to States for Capital Expenditure"

- The Ministry of Finance announced that it is to provide Rs 15,000 crores to the states for their Capital Expenditure for 2021-22.
- This is being provided as interest free fifty-year loan to spend on capital projects. Fresh guidelines have been announced in this regard.

COVID19 curbs to delay multiplexes recovery

According to the report by domestic credit rating agency Crisil, Localised lockdowns and night curfews amid the newer wave of COVID-19 are set to take a toll on multiplexes in the country, and companies in this sector will report operating losses for the second consecutive year.

Fish die in Lebanon

- Around forty tonnes of fish were washed on the banks of Qaraoun lake due to excessive pollution.
- The pollution was mainly due to sewage dumping. This has gained an international spotlight. Such a huge disaster is happening for the first time in the region.

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

First embalmed pregnant woman

- The researchers of Poland discovered the first embalmed pregnant woman. This is the first time in the history scientists have found a foetus in a mummy.
- The identification was made under the "Warsaw Mummy Project".

Facebook to offer vaccine finder tool

- Facebook said it is partnering with the Indian government to roll out a vaccine finder tool on its mobile app in India, which will help people identify places nearby to get inoculated.
- The information will be available in 17 languages.

- It was initiated from the Labour Union Movement.

Rajasthan Royals fast bowler Jaydev Unadkat will donate 10% of his IPL salary to help COVID-19 patients who need essential medical resources as India battles an unprecedented health crisis.

Former Attorney General Soli Sorabjee passes away

- Eminent jurist and former Attorney General of India Soli Sorabjee passed away on Friday due to COVID19 complications.
- He appeared in several historic cases, including the Kesavananda Bharati case or the Basic Structure Doctrine case. He received the Padma Vibhushan for championing free speech and human rights.

- Octogenarian Chandro Tomar, who became the oldest woman sharp shooter in the world after taking up the sport in her 60s, died after battling COVID-19. She was 89.
- Tomar, who was nick named 'Shooter Dadi' for her exploits.
