#### NATIONAL

#### 1) President's Colour to the Indian Naval Aviation

President Ram Nath Kovind has awarded the President's Colour to the Indian Naval Aviation at a ceremonial parade held at the INS Hansa base near Panjim in Goa. The president was given the guard of honour by the Indian Navy on the occasion. The President's Colour is the highest honour bestowed on a military unit in recognition of its exceptional service to the nation.

# 2) "Shikshak Parv-2021"

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has inaugurated the "Shikshak Parv-2021" and addressed the inaugural conclave through a video conference. The theme of 'Shikshak Parv-2021' is "Quality and Sustainable Schools: Learnings from Schools in India". The event was organised by the Ministry of Education.

### 3) Atmanirbhar Bharat corner

Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India in collaboration with the Ministry of External Affairs, is setting up an Atmanirbhar Bharat corner in 75 Indian Missions/ Embassies across the world in the next 3 months. With the focus on "Vocal for Local" and building an "Atmanirbhar Bharat", TRIFED is undertaking several activities, while rededicating its efforts towards tribal empowerment.

4) Joint Working Group Air Systems in the Defence Technology and Trade Initiative India and the US have signed a Project Agreement to jointly develop an Air-launched Unmanned Aerial Vehicle or drones that can be launched from an aircraft. The PA was signed under the Joint Working Group Air Systems in the Defence Technology and Trade Initiative, between India's Ministry of Defence and the US Department of Defence.

## 1) Right to Sit

Tamil Nadu government has tabled a bill to amend Tamil Nadu Shops and Establishments Act, 1947. The bill sought to add a subsection to mandatorily provide seating facilities for the employees. 
## 1) Bank of Baroda tops the MeitY Digital Payment Scorecard for 2020-21

### 1) Deepor Beel Wildlife Sanctuary

The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has notified the Eco-sensitive zone of the Deepor Beel Wildlife Sanctuary (Assam). Kaziranga National Park became the first in the country to use satellite phones and Dehing Patkai and Raimona were designated as National Parks.

# 1) Rajni Kaul

Rajni Kaul who was the first News Broadcaster for BBC Hindi passed away in Faridabad, Haryana. She was 93. She was not only the first woman to join BBC Hindi as a staff member but she also became the first woman to read a news bulletin in Hindi on the network in 1961. She was well-known for her programme Indradhanush.

# 2) Keshav Desiraju

Former Union health secretary Keshav Desiraju has passed away, due to "acute coronary syndrome". Desiraju was the grandson of former president Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan. He was the 1978 batch IAS officer from the Uttarakhand cadre. He was known for his contributions to mental health and community healthcare. He was the architect of India's mental healthcare act of 2017.
